

HIGHLIGHTS

- Oregon’s Health Security, Preparedness and Response Program (HSPR) provides operational and technical guidance, infrastructure support, and funding allocations to assist the state’s health care coalitions (HCCs) develop partnerships, coordinate resources, and recover from disaster.
- HSPR maintains 7 HCCs that support a total of 36 counties, 34 health departments, 62 hospitals, and a population of over 4 million.
- Oregon has a team of HCC liaisons that facilitate HPP grant deliverables, maintain situational awareness, and support emergency response operations.

of public health departments





SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE: 2017 Wildfire Season

- Oregon’s HSPR has a documented program history of over 40 incident management activations since 2006, and 22 alone over the last 5-years.
- In 2017, Oregon experienced a total of 1,069 reported wildfires—779 were human-ignited, with lightning strikes causing the remaining 290—including the state’s eighth largest fire. Fire burned a total area of 451,863 acres.
- HCCs across Oregon provided situational awareness, supported evacuations, managed scarce resources, and assisted public health response to special needs populations due to poor air quality.

FY 2018 PRIORITIES

- **Community Resilience:** HCCs continue to increase their membership, update their current governance, and develop annual, long-term preparedness plans to guide their ongoing activities.
- **Countermeasures and Mitigation:** HSPR continues to train HCCs on Strategic National Stockpile distribution plans, CHEMPACK management, and other countermeasure resource plans and programs. HSPR plans to evaluate its statewide supply chain integrity.
- **Surge Management:** HSPR will update and exercise the statewide medical surge and fatality management plan. They plan to develop a statewide family reunification plan for all HCCs and Tribes.
