

HIGHLIGHTS

- New York City (NYC) uses HPP funds to mature the city's health care coalition (HCC) and to develop and leverage relationships from all health care sectors to prepare for, respond to, and recover from large-scale emergencies
- In FY 2017, a draft NYC HCC charter was written in collaboration with the coalition leadership council members and the NYC Health and Advisory Committee to formalize this important relationship among key partners
- NYC increased nursing home and adult care facility emergency preparedness through the continuation of the Long Term Care Emergency Management Program

SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE: Ebola Response

In anticipation of the need to isolate and treat an external ventricular drain (EVD) patient, New York City prepared Bellevue Hospital's west isolation and special pathogens unit to serve as the primary facility for EVD care. HPP funds were used to support essential upgrades and maintenance for this unit. Funds were also used to ensure safety and implement appropriate safety measures. In November 2014, Bellevue received and successfully treated a person with EVD

FY 2018 PRIORITIES


- **Continue to Develop Health Care Coalition:** Mature the NYC HCC by engaging core member partners and recruiting other segments of the health care system
- **Increase Emergency Preparedness:** Strengthen emergency preparedness for coalition members by assessing emergency operation plans through exercises and training opportunities
- **Increase Information Sharing:** Maintain the ability to share information with health care facilities before, during and after an emergency
