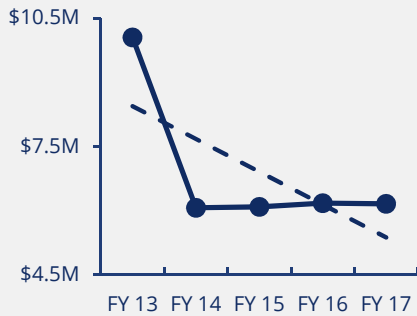

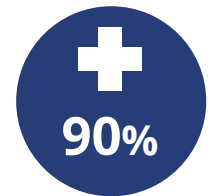
**39% decrease in funding**

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Michigan has eight health care coalitions (HCC) across the state that support the health and safety of the state's 9.8 million residents
- The HCCs have built a high level of collaboration among health care, emergency management, public health departments, emergency medical services, fire, police departments, nonprofits, and local businesses that aids in response and community resiliency
- Each HCC uses systems developed from HPP funds
- All HCCs have an operational role in response and are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- 189 hospitals participate in Michigan's HCCs
- Michigan used Ebola funding to develop the Special Pathogen Response Network to address potential emerging pathogen threats

## SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE: Hepatitis A Outbreak

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) continues to combat the effects of a Hepatitis A outbreak that began in August 2016. As of May 2018, MDHHS has identified over 800 cases with 675 hospitalizations. Transmission appears to be through person-to-person contact and illicit drug use. MDHHS continues to provide health care awareness, vaccination, public notifications and education to high-risk populations to mitigate the risk of infection.

## FY 2018 PRIORITIES

- Strengthen and enhance readiness that reduces morbidity and mortality through use of HPP capabilities, strategies, and gap assessments
- Build systems for saving lives that may exceed day to day health care capacities
- Enhance resources across the core partnerships of health care, public health, emergency management and emergency medical services to improve outcomes
- Increase the timely assessment and sharing of essential elements of information among all preparedness and response partners using electronic platforms developed through HPP
