PHE.gov is a web portal created by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. This site acts as a portal for residents in the U.S. and worldwide to obtain information from all U.S. federal agencies involved in a public health emergency, a medical disaster or public health aspects of a natural or man-made disaster.

Unified Public Health and Medical Services Support

Congress passed Pandemic and All Hazards Preparedness Act (PAHPA) of 2006 "to improve the Nation's public health and medical preparedness and response capabilities for emergencies, whether deliberate, accidental, or natural." The Act establishes within HHS an Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response to guide cross governmental public health and medical services preparedness and response activities; provides specific authorities, including the advanced development and acquisitions of medical countermeasures, and requires the implementation of a National Health Security Strategy.

This portal provides visitors with current status and actions taken by the federal government in preparing for and responding to public health emergencies and medical disasters and other potential health threats.

Emergency


