Dr. Tammy Spain agreed with need to focus on seeking evidence as a science board and voiced the need to have creative thinking, in particular to looking if there's evidence in the education system. Dr. Anderson indicated the need to be scientifically based and stated one of the potential tactics for the task will be prioritization for research agenda and/or data that may not exist.
