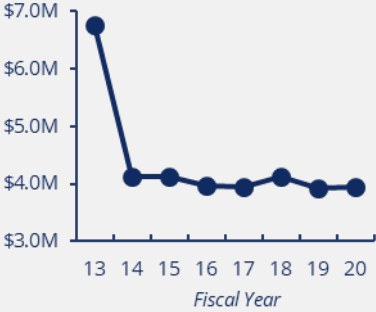

## HIGHLIGHTS

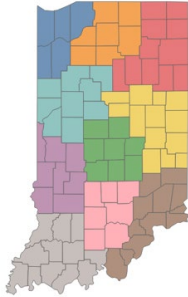
- Indiana has ten health care coalitions (HCCs) covering metropolitan, suburban, and rural areas that serve a total population of 6.8 million residents.
- The Indiana State Department of Health (ISDH) has served as the lead state agency in the response to the COVID-19 pandemic over the past year.
- All Indiana HCCs are, or have, fiscal agents that are 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations focused on health care.

## SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE

To minimize transmission of the virus, expand testing capacity, and vaccinate Indiana residents, ISDH partnered with several other state agencies. ISDH established and deployed Mobile Unit teams in each of Indiana's ten districts to increase public health services beyond the local health services already offered. ISDH also collaborated with state agencies to promote a program known as "Home Bound Hoosiers". This program was designed to make the COVID-19 vaccine available to Indiana residents that would otherwise not have access.

## COVID-19 RESPONSE

- Indiana's preparedness and response efforts in 2020 have been fully focused on the COVID-19 pandemic and include the following activities:
  - Expanding and improving testing efforts
  - Distributing the COVID-19 vaccine
  - Distributing personal protective equipment (PPE)
  - Creating guidance documents for health care facilities
