

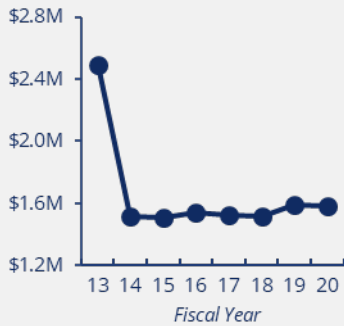

HIGHLIGHTS

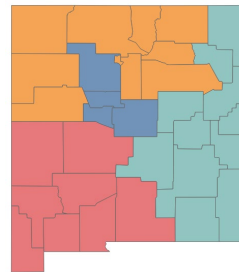
- New Mexico (NM) continued to strengthen partnerships with American Indian tribes, pueblos, and nations through the annual Tribal Preparedness Summit and the NM Department of Health Office of the Tribal Liaison as part of the State-Tribal Collaboration Act.
- NM prepared for an influx of migrants from the U.S./Mexico border in partnership with health care coalitions (HCCs), community groups, nongovernmental organizations, the Medical Reserve Corps, and federal partners. Response partners updated strategies to include COVID-19 safety considerations and humanitarian interventions.

SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE

The NM Medical Reserve Corps (NMMRC), established through ASPR's Emergency System for Advance Registration of Volunteer Health Professionals (ESAR-VHP) program, has statewide and inter-coalition mutual aid partnerships with its HCCs. NMMRC coordinators attend coalition meetings to report on volunteer activities and capabilities. HCCs and NMMRC units work together, along with the lead state emergency management agency, to develop pre-planned Mission Ready Packages for response deployment through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) system.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

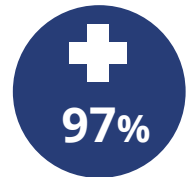
- Each of the state's four coalitions has an NMMRC unit to support regional response and facilitate the rapid sharing of emergency aid and resources. As of February 2021, NMMRC provided nearly 60,000 paid hours and 10,000 volunteer hours staffing multiple COVID-19 response missions including sheltering, vaccinations, testing, mental health strike teams, hotline call workers, alternate care sites, and contact tracing.
- NM used ASPR COVID-19 supplemental funding to upgrade software in 100+ bilevel positive airway pressure (BiPAP) machines, doubling their capacity across the state. NM also used the funding to launch full time HCC Emergency Manager positions in all four HCCs.
